9th Grade Lottery and Wait List Information



Before the Deadline

We begin accepting applications on Monday, October 8th 2018.
Application Deadline is Friday, March 1st 2019 at 4:00 pm.

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The Lottery

After the deadline for applications has passed, all applicants with completed applications are assigned a random number by computer. The computer then randomly selects these numbers giving us an acceptance list and a wait list.

A maximum number of 100 freshmen students will be admitted for the 2019- 20 academic year. For the 9th grade lottery, priority is given to certain applicants in the following order:

- Group A- Siblings of current HFAA students and children of current HFAA employees who turn in completed applications.
- Group B- Students who live within the boundaries of the Oklahoma City Public School district who turn in completed applications. (In-District)
- Group C- Students who live outside the boundaries of the Oklahoma City Public School district who turn in completed applications. (Out-of-District)
- Those freshmen not selected in the lottery will go on a numbered waiting list.
- Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
- Students turning in applications after the lottery go on the numbered waiting list.



Acceptance and Enrollment

Acceptance (or wait list) letters and enrollment information will be mailed within 7 business days to all parents/guardians of students who submitted completed applications. If an accepted student does not complete and return the enrollment forms by the designated date on the acceptance letter, then his/her spot will be given to the next person on the waiting list and the student will be placed at the end of the waiting list.



Wait List

Those not selected for the lottery go on a numbered waiting list. Space must be available without over-populating a class(es) before a student will be given the opportunity to enroll. Otherwise, we will move to the next student on the wait list. (We do this in an effort to allow additional students to enroll whenever possible.)

10th, 11th & 12th Grade Transfer Students

Space for students transferring to HFAA is limited. After returning students are enrolled (10th, 11th & 12th) additional student enrollment is based on the availability of a students' required/desired class(es). **(It is usually the summer before the school year before we can determine availability of new transfer students.)**
