

Our school counselors and teachers often talk about college readiness. Beginning their 9th grade year, we begin preparing students for the next step: university, junior college, or technical school. The biggest question our guidance counseling office gets from parents is, "What can I be doing to help my student prepare for college?" HFAA does a lot to prepare your student and arm him or her with ideas to consider and questions to ask when college and career planning, but the first and most rudimentary step is your student's grades. Without good grades your child's choices are limited in two major ways: what type of schools they are eligible to apply to and for what kind of scholarships may they apply.

What are ways that you can do this?

- If your child is in need of extra help take advantage of the free tutoring that we offer after school. If this is not enough, contact Ms. Stacy or Ms. Reed about setting up some one-on-one time with a teacher.
- There are centers in the community that do intensive tutoring with students as well. For example, places like Sylvan learning center or School Tutoring Academy offer tutoring, just to name a couple.
- Also, students need time to study, and where and how long they study is critical to learning. Students need a quiet, distraction-free environment either at home or at a library, maybe even book store. Additionally, while we want our children to have responsibilities around the house, such as chores, or be involved in other activities, we all only have so many hours in a day and children need sleep. So, if you have to occasionally cleanup something around the house for them or remove a household responsibility to allow them time to do Ms. Crismyre's U.S. homework, do it.

Also, it's never too soon to begin preparing for the college admissions exams! Having a high ACT / SAT score is another key factors of getting into a college of their choice. Students shouldn't wait until their senior or even junior year to start their preparation (See ACT prep classes on page 3 of this newsletter.) In addition, Sylvan Learning Center offers a free practice test at their Belle Isle center every 3rd Saturday of each month. For more information email at tisha.clay@sylvanlearning.com.
